

## Probate Notes for September 18, 2015

Probate notes are a recommendation as to the outcome of the petition. Unlike tentative rulings, they do not automatically become adopted as the order of the court. Unless an appearance at the hearing is otherwise required by law, if petitioner submits a proposed order prior to the hearing and the recommendation is to grant the petition, no appearance is necessary. If you are scheduled to appear and there is no probate note issued in your case, you should appear as scheduled. If you wish to continue a matter, you must contact the civil division at (530) 406-6704, at least two (2) court days before your hearing.

**Please note:** The Yolo Superior Court is now located at 1000 Main Street, in Woodland. The following probate matters will be heard in **Department Eleven at 9:00 a.m.**

**CASE:            Conservatorship of Jurado**  
**Case No. CV P2 14-107**

The Court notes the following deficiency: the conservator failed to file the required accounting as ordered by the Court on September 19, 2014. (Prob. Code, § 2620.)

It is recommended to approve the court investigator's report. (Prob. Code, § 1850 et seq.)

**CASE:            Conservatorship of Macias**  
**Case No. CV PB 04-105**

It is recommended to approve the court investigator's report and sixth verified account and report of conservator. (Prob. Code, §§ 1850 et seq., 2620, 1060.) Petitioner is directed to submit a proposed order prior to the date of the hearing.

**CASE:            Conservatorship of Quinlan**  
**Case No. CV PB 94-20810**

The Court is waiting for the court investigator to file his report, which is expected to be filed on September 17, 2015.

**CASE:            Conservatorship of Shade**  
**Case No. CV PC 15-119**

The Court notes the following deficiencies:

1. The following paragraphs of the petition are blank: 1(c), 3(e), and 3(f).
2. Proof that the citation and petition were served on the proposed conservatee at least 15 days before the hearing has not been filed with the Court. (Prob. Code, § 1824.)
3. Proof that the notice of hearing has been served on the required parties has not been filed with the Court. (Prob. Code, § 1822.)
4. The attachment requesting special orders regarding dementia (form GC-313) is not attached to the petition.

5. An acknowledgment of receipt of the *Duties of Conservator and Acknowledgement of Receipt of Handbook* form has not been filed with the Court. (Prob. Code, § 1834; Cal. Rules of Court, rule 7.1051.)

Additionally, the Court notes that the petition states the proposed conservatee is unable to attend the hearing because of medical inability. However, the capacity declaration filed on July 2, 2015, states that the proposed conservatee is able to attend the hearing.

**CASE:            Conservatorship of Thomas**  
**Case No. CV PC 14-91**

On the Court's own motion, the matter is **CONTINUED** to Friday, October 16, 2015, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 11 for completion of the court investigator's report.

**CASE:            LPS Conservatorship of Carter**  
**Case No. LP SQ 09-15**

The parties are **DIRECTED TO APPEAR** for a hearing regarding the conservatee's placement, as ordered by the Court on August 14, 2015.
